## NATIONAL DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

The word I would chose to sum up this past year begins with a "C". Nope, it's not Covid.

#### It's Collaboration.

Since last fall, Diaconal Ministries has worked hard to deepen our relationships with a variety of CRC agencies in order to better serve and equip deacons all across Canada. Our Diaconal Coaches have also begun collaborating with one another and with local organizations to encourage and support deacons in their important work.

Even before Covid-19 hit this past March, several conversations were beginning with agencies like World Renew, the CRC Office of Social Justice, the Canadian Indigenous Ministries Committee (CIM-C) and the Northern Alberta Diaconal Conference to see where there was overlap and opportunity to work together. The fruit of these conversations can be found throughout this annual report. While Covid-19 presented several challenges for us (as well as churches like yours), we found new ways to move forward and grow, BECAUSE we had begun those crucial conversations and were leaning into where our Heavenly Father was already at work.

For us, GROWTH means to cultivate, develop, produce, and branch out - building on what we already have to extend our reach and deepen our impact.

We've done this through Collaboration.

When we hear the word "GROW", we usually think 'bigger' and 'better' and sometimes 'more'. Most of the growth we're seeing here and around the world right now is pretty depressing: we are seeing an increase in loss (of profits and people), a rise in fear and anxiety, bigger lines at the food bank, and more and more political divide.

But the GROWTH we're talking about is different. For us, growth has meant to build, cultivate, develop, produce, and branch out. Over the past months and

year, this is how Diaconal Ministries has been growing. Not with bigger budgets or more staff or the latest, greatest technology, but by building on what we already have and branching out to extend our reach and deepen our impact. We've done this through COLLABORATION. We believe we are always better together.

None of this would be possible without your support, so thank you. May we continue to trust God and ask for His perfect wisdom as we all carry on, ever growing in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ (2 Peter 3:18)

#### **ENGAGE COMMUNITIES**

Engaging with your surrounding community requires years of building trust, getting to know your neighbourhood - its unique assets and needs - and most importantly, seeing where God is at work already!



Deacons encourage their congregations to live as God's stewards over everything we've been given. More practically, to ask the question: "How can my whole life show that Jesus is my Lord?"






#### PROMOTE MERCY & JUSTICE

Justice is essentially about relationships: our relationships with God, with each other, with ourselves, and with creation. God calls each one of us to restore relationships by doing justice and loving mercy.

## HOW WE WORK

The primary role of Diaconal Ministries' Staff is to train and support our network of Diaconal Coaches. Our coaches then equip and encourage deacons as they lead and animate their own congregations.



## WE OUR COACHES

Our network of Diaconal Coaches are trained and experienced in diaconal work. They are ready and willing to guide deacons as they work out their calling in their church and community.

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#### **WORKSHOPS HELD**

Our Coaches and Field Staff led helpful workshops like the Deacon 101 Workshop, Helping Without Harming, and were also part of some 'Days of Encouragement' across Canada.

In March and April, Diaconal Ministries' staff were meeting **weekly** with our Coaches via Zoom to check-in, offer support and hear what deacons needed in the uncertain times they were facing.

As a result, a <u>Covid Resource page</u> was created on our website with several curated resources added to it, including **nine (9)** brand new ones!

Coaches also held church and classis-wide Zoom meetings with deacons to check in and to have a time of sharing and support.

## **OUR PARTNERSHIPS...**

As ministry needs change and expand for Deacons, Diaconal Ministries understands that collaboration is key. We have worked even closer with our partners this past year to equip deacons in the areas of justice, stewardship and community engagement, knowing we are always better TOGETHER.

#### FOUR (4) COVID-RELATED WEBINARS

Over 300 deacons and ministry leaders took part in these FREE webinars this past spring with topics including local & global engagement and mental health during the pandemic.

#### SEVENTEEN (17) COVID-19 GRANTS

Over \$50,000 was awarded to seventeen Canadian CRCs to assist them in Covid-related diaconal work to bless their community.

#### TWO (2) HELPING WITHOUT HARMING WORKSHOPS

This workshop has continued to garner interest as deacons seek to engage in their communities in helpful, sustainable ways. Two (2) more were planned for the spring but were postponed due to Covid.

#### STEWARDSHIP PILOT PROJECT (SPP)

The Stewardship Pilot Project was created to increase a church's awareness of the Biblical principles of stewardship and help them live those principles out in practical, measurable ways. After much research and vetting of stewardship resources and other preliminary work by Karla, the SPP Coordinator, eleven (11) churches across Canada expressed interest in being part of the pilot project. Preliminary "work" was to be done over the summer by each participating church with the program set to launch in the fall of 2020. *Then Covid hit.* 

Karla respected the need for churches to press 'pause' and focus on their new reality amidst the pandemic. Karla put time and energy in creating some Covid-related resources in the areas of stewardship (giving) and benevolence, which were added to our Covid Resource page.

Karla also put together some introductory documents for each of the 4 T's of stewardship (Time, Talents, Trees and Treasures) as well as guidelines for building a stewardship team which were shared on our website for all churches to see and use. These will eventually be part of a "toolkit" which is currently being worked on.

During the summer months, Karla reached out once again to the participating churches to offer a 5-week Stewardship Bible Study via Zoom to continue to engage them in the SPP. This study proved fruitful as one church is ready to move forward with building their stewardship team. While the SPP has had a slower start, Karla has felt God affirming her work; as good stewards must first be good disciples, time spent strengthening the project's spiritual grounding and building relationships has made it a much more sustainable endeavour.



#### **OUR REVENUE**

\$514,722

Diaconal Ministry Shares continue to be our primary funding source. We are pleased that approximately 75% of churches gave 100% of their shares. We also received a wage subsidy grant from the federal government as part of Canada's Covid-19 Economic Plan. This past spring, our NewGround Offerings were down as churches were not gathering in their usual ways due to Covid. Yet, as some costs of running the program were less than usual, and with the receipt of some government grants, we will still be able to fund our NewGround partners for the coming year!




